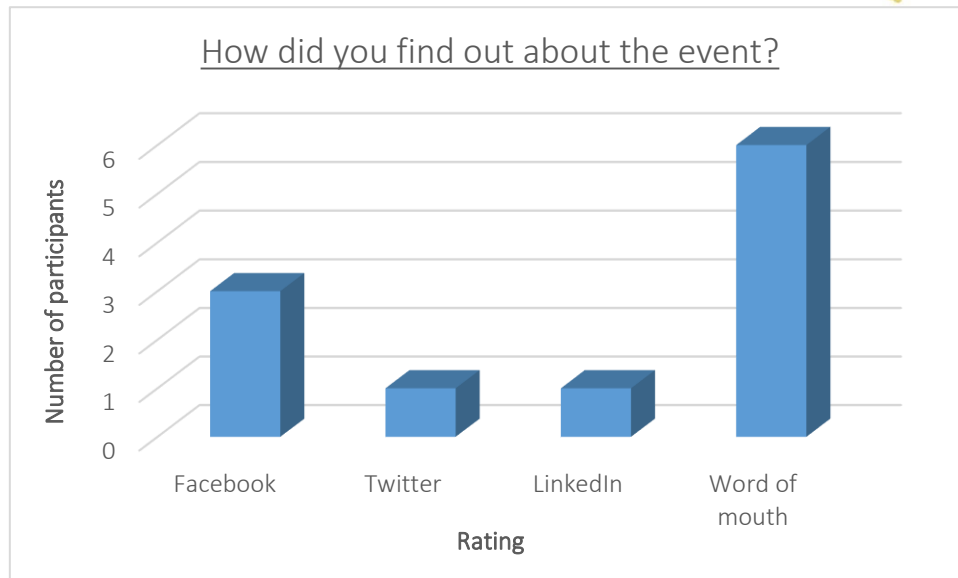


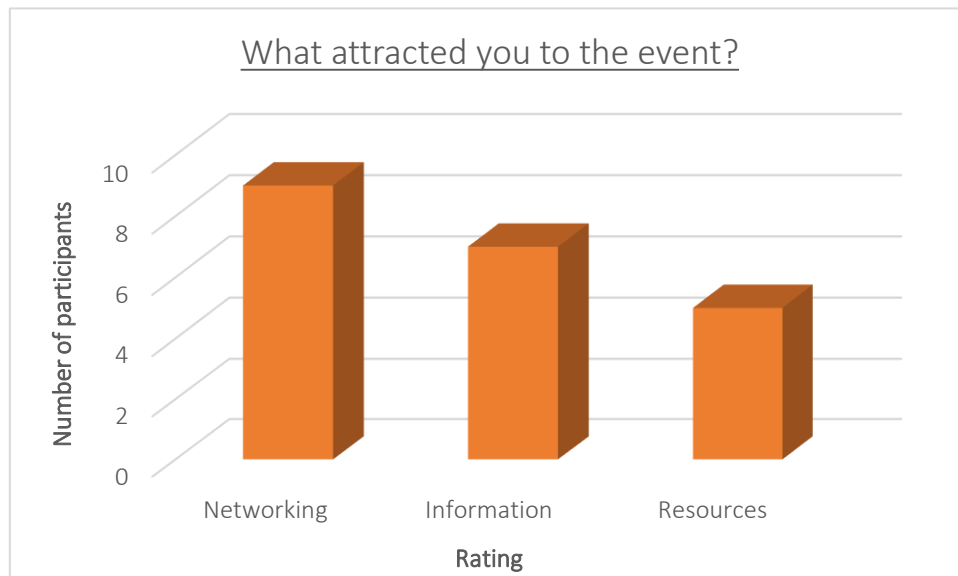


Peer to Peer Network Feedback Report

- Available services that can be offered to families (2 people said)

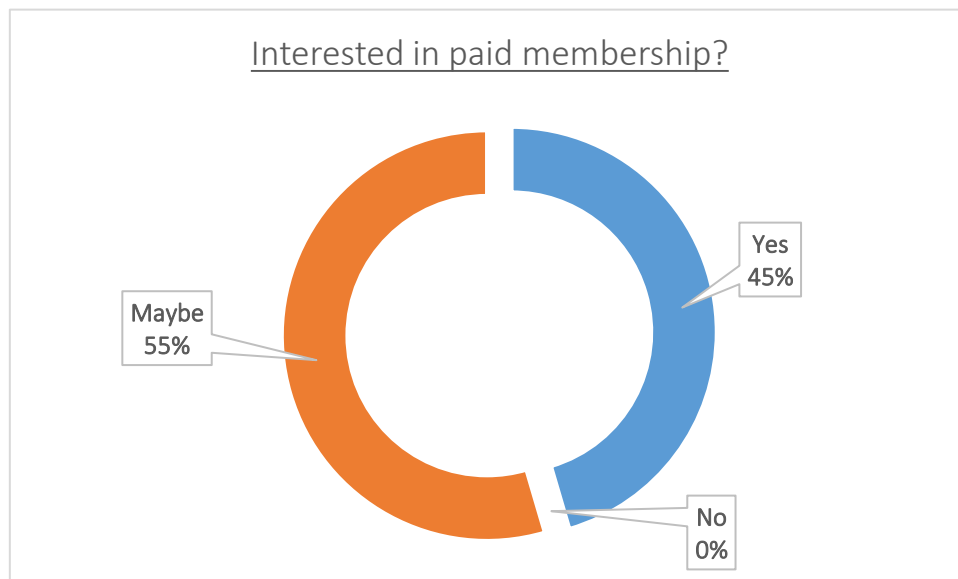
Which area of domestic abuse would you like to be covered in future peer to peer sessions?
